BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON EUBAM



- □ Launched on 30 November 2005 at the request of Presidents of Moldova and Ukraine
- □ EUBAM is a technical, advisory body. No executive powers.
- □ Works with Moldova and Ukraine to harmonise border control, customs and trade standards with those in EU Member States
- Main partners are border guard and customs agencies of Moldova and Ukraine





Why Trade Facilitation?

- Response to the global & national economy needs
- Investment stimulus
- JIT Just In Time Logistic Model (used often by the global companies)
- Economic growth =Development =improvements in living standards

CUSTOMS

Customs supervision and control of IM/EX/Transiting goods

Fiscal role = BUDGET

Fight against violation of customs legislation; law enforcement;

Compliance with trade regulations on the prohibitions and restrictions



Support the trade facilitation with minimal controls and smooth movement of goods

Simplification of customs rules and procedures

Facilitation of efficient customs transactions in line with modern-day needs

Protection of the security, safety and fiscal interests of the state and citizens










Customs Clearance Model

Association Agreement/DCFTA

Objective - balanced approach to effective control, security, prevention of fraud & support facilitation of legitimate trade.

Approximation of customs legislation (Art. 84)

 <u>AA/DCFTA Art. 84 & Annex XV</u>: Gradual approximation to the EU customs legislation as laid down in the EU and international standards shall be carried out... within three years following the entry into the force;





Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA)

- WORLD TRADE ORGANIZATION
- Publication of existing import-export regulations on the Internet
- Stakeholder consultation on new draft regulations (prior to their finalization)
- Advance publication/notification of new regulation before their implementation
- Advance Ruling (e.g. tariff classification)
- Risk management
- Pre-arrival clearance
- Post-clearance audit
- Independent appeal mechanism
- National Single Window
- Separation of Release from final determination of Customs duties, taxes, fees and charges;
- Establishment and publication of average release times;
- Trade facilitation measures for authorized operators; and
- Expedited shipments (direct delivery or next day service).



Customs Blueprints

Blueprint 8. 'Trade facilitation'

To develop and implement measures to minimise the costs, data and documentation requirements and the time necessary for the trading community to complete customs and other border formalities.

To develop a close partnership between customs (and other relevant governmental authorities, where appropriate) and the trading community through transparent, efficient and effective procedures.
